Africa CDC and Unitaid: Advancing Health Equity and Regional Manufacturing

his week marks a significant milestone in Africa's health security agenda.

On 18 May 2025, the Africa Centres for Disease Control and Prevention (Africa CDC) and Unitaid have signed a new Memorandum of Understanding (MoU) to expand the production of essential health products in Africa and improve sustainable access to medicines, diagnostics, and medical oxygen across the continent.

Signed on the margins of the 78th World Health Assembly (WHA78), the agreement positions regional manufacturing as a cornerstone of Africa's health autonomy and resilience. It reflects a shared commitment to shift from dependency toward sustainability by ensuring critical health commodities are produced closer to the point of care.

Africa CDC and Ghana Strengthen Surveillance and Data Sharing

n 14 May 2025, Africa CDC signed a Memorandum of Understanding (MoU) with the Government of Ghana to bolster cross-border surveillance and data sharing—two key pillars of epidemic preparedness and early warning systems. The agreement aims to enhance Ghana's capacity to

manage and respond to health emergencies effectively.

Dr Jean Kaseya, Director General of Africa CDC, joined Hon. Kwabena Mintah Akandoh, Ghana's Minister of Health, to reaffirm their joint commitment to reinforcing primary healthcare systems and enhancing

Africa's collective capacity to respond to public health threats. The MoU also encompasses collaborative efforts to ensure vaccine access, diagnostics, and emergency supply readiness.

AFRICA CDC AT WHA78

WHOAFRO Regional Director Nominated | 18 May 2025



Prof. Mohamed Janabi, nominated by the Government of Tanzania, has been selected as the next Regional Director of the World Health Organization African Region (WHOA-fro) during a Special Session of the WHO Regional Committee for Africa held on 18 May 2025 in Geneva.

His formal appointment will be confirmed by the WHO Executive Board during its upcoming session on 28–29 May 2025, after which he will officially assume office. Africa CDC congratulates Prof. Mohamed Janabi on his nomination. His leadership comes at a critical time, as the continent intensifies efforts to strengthen health systems, improve regional collaboration, and advance African-led solutions for public health challenges.

The event brought together African Ministers of Health, finance experts, multilateral institutions, and private sector leaders to explore bold strategies for financing Africa's health priorities. Discussions centred on the urgent need to reduce reliance on external aid and shift toward domestic resource mobilization, innovative financing mechanisms, and regulatory reforms as foundations for resilient health systems.

Unitaid Side Event at WHA78 | 18 May 2025

At the Unitaid-hosted side event during the 78th World Health Assembly (WHA78) on 18 May 2025, Dr Jean Kaseya underscored the urgency of advancing African-led solutions to shape the future of global health.

He emphasized that long-term investment in local manufacturing, research, and innovation is essential for building resilient, self-reliant health systems. Dr Kaseya called on international partners to align with Africa's priorities and work in close partnership with African institutions to shift the paradigm from dependency to sustainability.

This intervention builds on the growing momentum around regional manufacturing and follows the strategic partnership formalized between Africa CDC and Unitaid during WHA78.

Meeting with H.E. John Dramani Mahama, President of Ghana

On 14 May in Accra, Dr Jean Kaseya and H.E. Commissioner Amma Twum Amoah, African Union Commissioner for Health, Humanitarian Affairs, and Social Development, met with H.E. President John Dramani Mahama to discuss long-term political and financial support for Africa's public health agenda.

President Mahama reaffirmed his strong commitment to Africa CDC and expressed support for strategic initiatives to expand local manufacturing, strengthen domestic health financing mechanisms, and reinforce national public health systems. He also highlighted the role of national programmes such as Mahama Cares in advancing sustainable health development across the continent.

Meeting with the Prime Minister, Côte d'Ivoire | 12 May 2025

On 12 May 2025, Dr Jean Kaseya held a high-level meeting in Abidjan with H.E. Prime Minister Robert Beugré Mambé and H.E. Minister of Health Pierre N'Gou Dimba to advance shared priorities for sustainable health financing in Côte d'Ivoire and across the continent.

During the meeting, Dr Kaseya presented Africa's Health Financing in a New Era—Africa CDC's strategic roadmap built on three key pillars:

- Mobilizing domestic resources
- Introducing innovative mechanisms such as the 5-5-7 Solidarity Levy
- Engaging the private sector to drive long-term investment in health

The discussion also explored actionable solutions to reduce outbound medical tourism, expand access to quality healthcare within the continent, and position Côte d'Ivoire as a regional leader in pharmaceutical manufacturing and digital health innovation.



he Africa CDC Epidemic Intelligence Weekly Report provides timely updates on ongoing and emerging public health threats across the continent. It highlights current disease trends, risk assessments, and public health response actions implemented by affected Member States, partners, and Africa CDC.

Focusing on moderate to very high-risk events, the report adopts a One Health and multisectoral lens to monitor outbreaks, natural disasters, and cross-border health emergencies. It includes both single-country and multicountry events, offering actionable intelligence to support early warning, coordinated response, and evidence-based decision-making.
